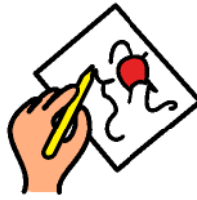


### Writing Contest

Draw it!



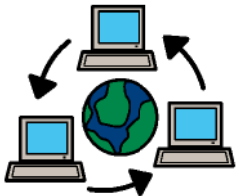
Share it!
