Communication Matters Journal

A Journal is like a newsletter, but with longer reports.

The **Communication Matters Journal** has reports about AAC from all sorts of different people.

AAC is used to mean many different ways to help someone communicate. It could be simple things like pointing, signing, writing or drawing. It could also be using a special device like a machine that 'speaks' words for you.

The Journal comes out three times a year in the UK.

We post a copy of the journal to all members.

The Journal has reports by AAC users, parents and professionals.

Each journal is usually about 40 pages.

We welcome reports written by AAC users and their parents/families.

Guidelines for writing reports

If you write a report for the journal, it should:

- Be in Microsoft Word format
- Be written in plain English
- Be no more than 2,000 words long
- Be about something that is new
